She was accompanied by Sh. Yogesh Gangani on Tabla, Sh. Ayub Khan on Sarangi & Sh. Samiullah Khan on Harmonium. Her performance was interactive where she explained the audience various mudras, bhav and taal in Kathak. The jugal-bandi between Gauri ji and Yogesh ji kept the audience on the edge.
